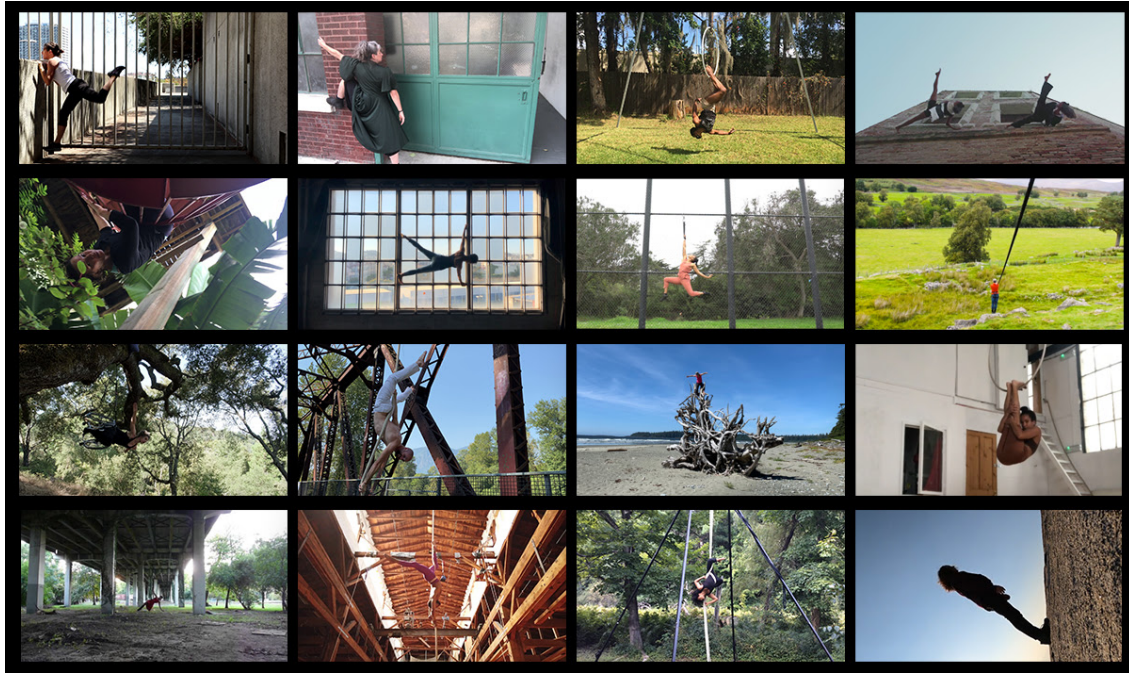

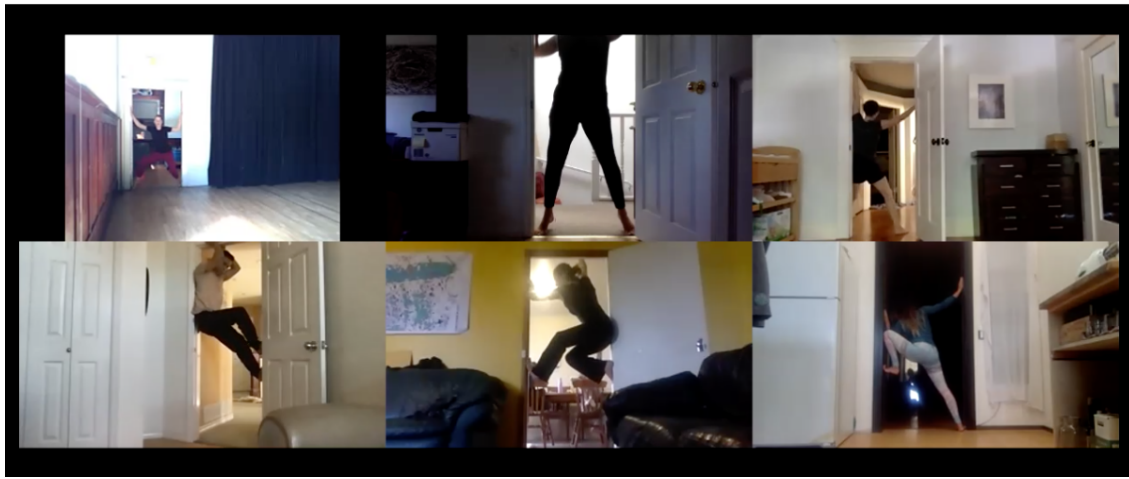

Featured Feathered Friend

Marbled Murrelet (*Brachyramphus Marmoratus*)

Aeriosa's work is often nature-centered. When dancing in the trees we regularly encounter other species. This column is dedicated to learning about our friends in flight.



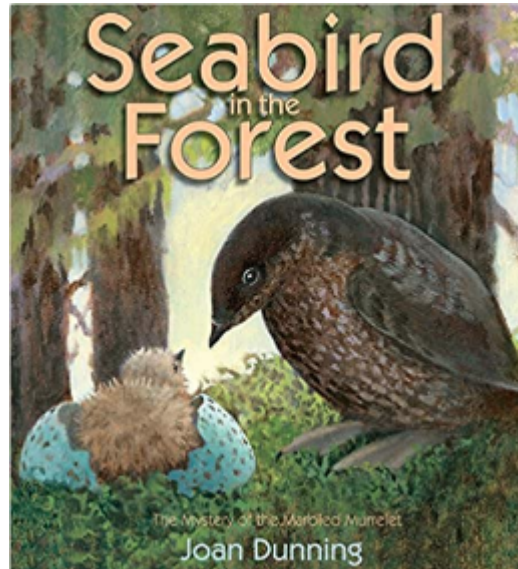
The Marbled Murrelet is a small seabird from the North Pacific, often spotted near rivermouths or just beyond the kelp line. It's known as the fogbird by loggers and fisherman because of its frequent calling at sea, piercing through the fog.

During the summer months, their colouring is a marbled white and light brown and in the winter, the adults feathers change to white and black! Their diet consists mostly of small fish and zooplankton and studies show they herd fish as a team, flying and steering underwater with their outstretched wings and feet. It was a mystery for several hundred years as to where the Marbled Murrelet laid its eggs. In the 1970's loggers discovered their nests in old growth

trees, as they usually nest in trees 200 years or older!

Epiphytic moss is an important element for the bird's nest and this only grows in moist old growth forests where the rain and fog is plentiful. Logging of old growth trees is a threat to this unique bird's habitat and survival.

If the Marbled Murrelet enchants you, Joan Dunning wrote a beautifully illustrated children's book about the mysteries of this bird. Her book won the Science Book and Film Prize for Excellence in Science Books.
